Refer directly to a community Fracture Clinic

Many simple fractures and soft-tissue injuries are suitable for management in primary care and do not require specialist orthopaedic management.

However, not every GP may be comfortable managing these conditions themselves. If this is the case, GP's may refer directly to one of the Primary Care Fracture and Soft Tissue Injury Services, available at several locations on the Sunshine Coast. *There is no need to send referrals to the SCHHS central Referral Centre!*

The service is bulk-billed and includes plaster or fibreglass casts, crutches, and braces/splints (e.g. moon-boots) if required.

Patients with suitable simple injuries who are seen in the Emergency Department or who are referred to Orthopaedic Fracture Clinic may also be offered this choice for their fracture or soft-tissue injury management.

GP's help to reduce hospital waitlists

Earlier this month we published the results of the Sunshine Coast GPSI pilot [in MJA Insight](#). It generated media interest from ABC, WIN and Seven.

GP's with a Special Interest (GPSIs) demonstrated they can play a role in reducing public hospital wait lists and increasing capacity of the health system.

It's a great team effort and we congratulate everyone who has participated and supported the pilot, especially our 24 GPSIs.

The pilot program improved collaboration and integration between general practice and hospital by facilitating collegiate contact and interprofessional learning between GP's and specialty teams.

Consultants, GPSIs and patients reported high satisfaction levels. Common feedback themes included value gained from bidirectional interprofessional learning and codesign of new outpatient discharge planning models.

GPSIs can help build hospital team confidence in primary care handover and identify which patients can be appropriately transferred back to the regular GP, facilitating continuity of care.

GPSIs often gained additional skills which also assisted to more confidently manage patients in the community. This may facilitate horizontal referrals between GP's in the future, reducing hospital referrals and demand for specialist outpatient services

Here at the GP Liaison Unit we believe it is essential to continue to develop and invest in integrated models of care as they can be part of the solution to a growing demand on public health services.



FASD Survey for GPs

A Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD) research study is currently being undertaken by SCHHS Dr Samantha Williams as a requirement of the RACP for Advanced Paediatric and Developmental training. Dr Williams is currently working in the Child Development clinic in Caloundra and regularly participates in the second of only two FASD clinics in Queensland.

It is the intention of the study to provide a snapshot of the current level of understanding of FASD and practices of health professionals in the Sunshine Coast area. This questionnaire is aimed at General Practitioners, Obstetricians, Paediatricians, Child health nurses and midwives.

The survey is completely anonymous, and Dr Williams will be reviewing the data with the hope to publish in a peer review journal. Study results will be used to inform and upskill health professionals working with antenatal and postnatal patients. The survey will run from September 2019 to January 2020.

Dr Williams is more than happy to arrange an education session for interested health professionals to discuss FASD and the current diagnostic process further if specific questions arise from completing this survey.

Caloundra Minor Injury and Illness Clinic opening earlier

From August 2019, the Minor Injury and Illness Clinic (MIIC) at Caloundra Health Service, is open an hour earlier to meet patient need. **The new operating hours are from 8am to 8pm, seven days a week.**

The MIIC opened in March 2017 and is designed to treat patients whose needs are non-life threatening. The team at the clinic treat patients with conditions such as fever, coughs, earache, toothache, minor eye issues, broken bones, minor cuts, burns, scalds, infections, rashes, sprains and strains.

Patients who require non-urgent treatment outside of the MIIC's opening hours should contact their GPs afterhours service or call 13 HEALTH (13 43 25 84). This is a free 24-hour hotline offering professional health advice.

Want to access Queensland Health results on your clinic desktop?

Did you know you can now look at internal Queensland Health patient results from your GP office computer? The **Health Provider Portal (HPP)** is now live. This puts clinical information immediately at your fingertips, rather than having to request a copy from Clinical Information Access. The amount of useful information shared with GPs on the HPP continues to expand. You have access to clinical information from all Queensland Health facilities.

The **Health Provider Portal (HPP)** currently allows registered QLD-based GPs to view the following;

- Pathology results
- Radiology results
- Discharge Summaries
- Emergency Department letters
- Outpatient appointment bookings
- *Soon will include elective surgery bookings*

Sounds fantastic! How do I register for HPP?

You or your practice manager will need to;

1. Ensure your GP name and practice details are correct in the STS Address book to receive electronic communication from Queensland Health
2. Create a personal QGov Login account if you do not already have one
3. Register for Health Provider Portal access once steps 1 and 2 are complete.
